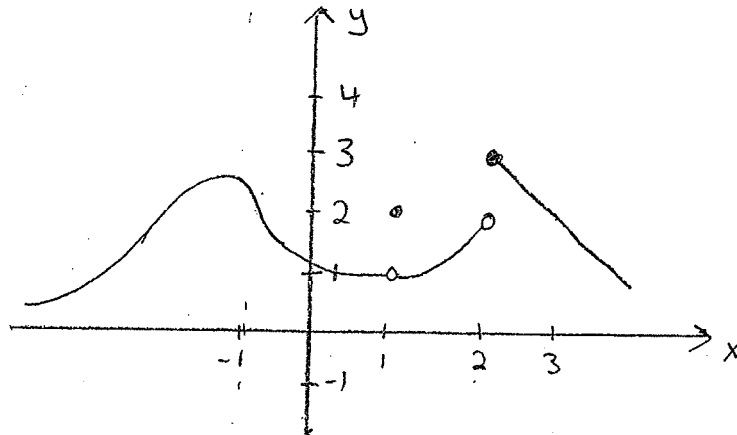

1) Compute the limits, if the graph of $y = g(x)$ is given as follows,



a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1} g(x)$

b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 1} g(x)$

c) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2} g(x)$

2) Define

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} x^2 - 1 & \text{if } x \leq 2 \\ x + 1 & \text{if } x > 2 \end{cases}$$

Compute the following limits or explain why they don't exist:

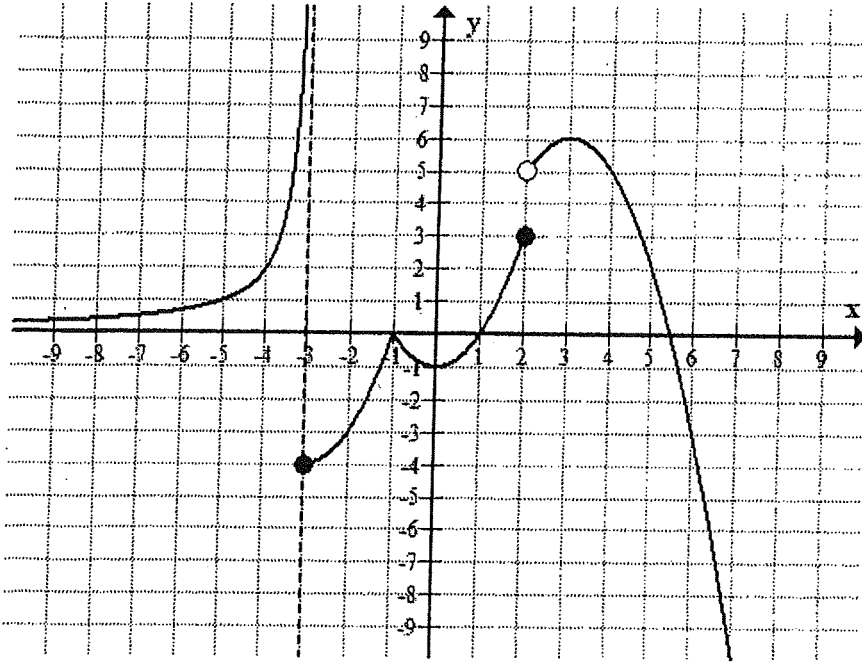
a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2^-} f(x)$

Problem 4 Sketch the graph of a function $y = f(x)$ which satisfies all of the following conditions:

(i) the domain of f is $(0, +\infty)$;

(ii) $f(2) = f(4) = 0$;

(iii) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 0^+} f(x) = -\infty$;

(iv) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2} f(x) = +\infty$;

(v) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 4^-} f(x) = 0$ and

$\lim_{x \rightarrow 4^+} f(x) = 1$;

(vi) $\lim_{x \rightarrow +\infty} f(x) = 3$.
