**Textbook:** "The Mathematics that every secondary school math teacher needs to know", by Sultan and Artzt, ISBN 978-0-415-99413-2

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Pre-requisite and expectations: Calculus 2, Discrete Mathematics are the prerequisite courses. If you haven't successfully passed these courses, you should see me. We will often consider concepts from these prerequisite courses, but we will expand the horizon on these concepts and the relations between them. This class will be partially flipped. This means that you will be asked to read and take notes from certain sections in the book or from instructor prepared materials, before the corresponding topics are covered in class. You will be regularly checked on your notes, or short pop-up guizzes will be given at the beginning of some classes. I will still briefly lecture in class on certain theoretical topics. Almost every class (exception are exam, or review for exam days) there will be a group-worksheet that will have to be submitted at the end of the class. You should devote ample time to work out all the suggested homework problems. Exam questions will come primarily from the suggested homework or from the announced theoretical topics (proofs that you need to study). The daily topics and the suggested assignments will be recorded on the class website (see my homepage). You are expected to acquire a certain degree of mathematical maturity from this course, you will be asked to understand, reproduce and conceive basic proofs.
