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Pre-requisite and expectations: Calculus 2, Discrete Mathematics are the prerequisite courses. If you don't have these courses, you should see me. We will often consider concepts from these prerequisite courses, but we will expand the horizon on these concepts and the relations between them. Often only certain highlights of a section will be presented in lecture in class, but you are responsible to read all the required material from the text. You should devote ample time to work out all the suggested homework problems. Exam questions will come primarily from the suggested homework. The daily topics and the suggested assignments will be recorded on the class website (see my homepage). You are expected to acquire a certain degree of mathematical maturity from this course, you will be asked to understand, reproduce and conceive basic proofs.
